Guidance

- Sit alongside the pupil.
- Apart from general encouragement for working hard, no help should be given to the pupil.
- If the pupil is clearly having difficulty (for example, labouring over each word on a line and getting most of them wrong) ask them to look at the next line and pick out any words that they know.
- Discontinue the test after a pupil has made ten consecutive errors or if it is evident that the pupil is becoming very frustrated.
- Make a note of each word the pupil reads correctly on section D of the Reading Skills Assessment Form (Resource R1).
- Add the number of words read correctly: this is the raw score for the test.
- For the pupil who is at the beginning of the learning to read process:
 - Say, "Here is a sheet of paper with lots of words. Let's see if you know some of them."
 - The early reader might be helped by you using a blank card to cover the lines below the one he/she is reading. Point to each word and encourage the pupil to do so with you.
 - Encourage the pupil to start at the first word "to" and to continue across the card and then along each successive line.
- For a pupil whose reading is reasonably advanced:
 - Say, "Here is a sheet of paper with lots of words. Let's see how many you can read. Read them aloud to me."
 - Encourage the pupil to start at the first word "to" and to continue across the card and then along each successive line.
